



## Albert Hernandez

Alberto “Albert” Villanueva Hernandez, age 42, passed away on Sunday morning, September 7, 2025, at Parkland Health Hospital in Dallas, Texas.

Albert was born on May 6, 1983, at Methodist Dallas Medical Center and spent most of his life in Dallas, Texas. A 2002 graduate of Walnut Springs High School, Albert was a natural athlete who excelled in football, basketball, and golf, earning recognition as a five time Player of the Week during his high school years. He attended ITT Technical Institute and later built a career as a forklift certified driver and freight handler for transportation companies across the DFW area. Albert was charismatic, confident, and deeply loved by those around him. He had a lifelong passion for sports, cars, grilling, and watching scary movies. He developed a special appreciation for golf, which led to a memorable encounter with then President George W. Bush in August of 2001 at a local golf course. 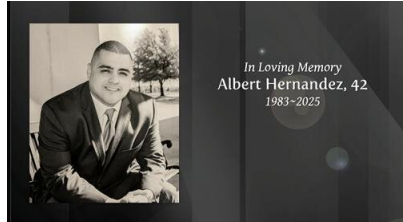
