“ Hello. I am Angie, the oldest of the Aceves sisters. Today, we gather here to remember and celebrate my sister, Veronica Aceves. A woman with incredible strength and an immeasurable forgiving and kind heart. She was born in El Paso, TX on November 14 in 1984 to Elio and Alma Aceves. She was the 4th sister and first triplet to be born. The day she was born was a happy and momentous day. Even the doctor's joy matched my family's excitement. Vero was the first triplet he had ever delivered and the celebration of her birth spread even into the local El Paso, TX news. She was born the strongest triplet premie. If you asked her, "Who are you?" she would proudly say, "Ero Vero." She was raised and lived in the Greater Los Angeles area until she moved to Fort Worth, Texas in 2006.

As a child in Kindergarten, she supported her crying sister. Instead of walking into her classroom, she would turn around to be with her sister. So it became 2 crying sisters, one compassionate and empathetic Vero.

In her early school years, she loved reading chapter books, especially The Baby Sitters Club series. Vero was also a great swimmer. She could swim for countless hours, showing us how she could plug her nose and swim into the deep end of the swimming pool. I didn't teach her, I still can't swim. Vero taught herself how to swim.

Vero loved her children, music, cooking and a nice cup of tea. She was so happy during her first pregnancy, she would say she was going to have her own real live doll. Mia was born a real live doll. Years later she had a son, J-Rod, whom she described as her sweet, sweet boy. With joy, she would share the stories of her children's growth and achievements, from J-Rod learning to write his letters and numbers, especially the number 5, to Mia's promotion certificate, to name a few. She was a strong mother who loved her children very much.

Vero loved music, all kinds of music. Music mixes perfectly well with

a favorite snack. Do you know what is one of Vero's favorite snacks? Of course, it is chips and her homemade spicy salsa. It was too hot for me to handle but perfect for Vero.

Vero loved cooking. We are as proud of Chef Vee, as her co-workers called her, just as much as she was for that accomplishment. She said she was "not just a cook anymore, she was Chef Veronica." I'd ask about the recipes she was preparing and she'd happily give me the French name. I still don't know what Vichy carrots are or how to cook them but Vero said they are easy and delicious.

Her smile, I remember. Her ranges of laughter, Vero had a soft giggle and a louder contagious laugh. She never forgot my birthday, a holiday, or special occasion. She always wanted everyone to be together and get along.

Vero, it was an honor and privilege being your sister. There are no more tomorrow's that we can share, but the yesterdays no one can take and will always be mine. May you have everything you need in heaven. Thank you, little Sister, for your strength, and your kind and forgiving heart.

As we say our final goodbyes to Vero, I want to share a quote, which is "to live in hearts we leave behind is not to die." This quote reminds us that although Vero is no longer physically with us, her spirit lives on in the love, laughter, and memories we share together. And in that sense, Vero will never be truly gone because she will live on in our hearts forever.
